



## 11.1 NATIONAL CONFERENCE

#### **A. Introduction**

This conference was aimed to bring together esteemed scholars, industry experts, policymakers, and professionals to discuss and exchange knowledge on the emerging tools and techniques in the field of pharmaceutical research and share the updated trends to the students of diploma, undergraduate, postgraduate, research scholars and faculty in pharmacy. The conference was featured by engaging plenary sessions by renowned experts from industry and academia and scientific presentations that covered a wide range of topics in the pharma and allied sectors.

#### **B. Background**

Sarojini College of Pharmacy, Kolhapur is committed to academic and professional excellence with a holistic development of the students. The institution recognizes the importance of bridging the gap between the theoretical knowledge imparted from the pharmacy course and the practical needs expected by the industry. In addition, in today’s world of competition, knowledge of the latest trends in the pharma sector is indispensable for career prospects and getting an edge over peers. In this pursuit, the institute collaborated with the esteemed organization in the pharma fraternity – the Association of Pharmacy Teachers (APTI) – Maharashtra Branch to facilitate this conference, ensuring that the students of diploma, UG, PG, PhD gain insights of the latest trends in pharma sector and competence in their career pursuits. Emerging Trends in Drug Discovery & Translational Research – 2025 is a pioneering conference dedicated to explore the cutting-edge techniques and research innovations in the pharmaceutical industry. This event was envisaged to bring together the renowned experts from the academia, research institutions and the pharma industry to discuss the emerging tools and techniques in the field of pharmaceutical research and bridges the basic scientific discoveries and their practical applications, particularly in the fields of medicine and health. Further, it aimed to accelerate the process of translating laboratory findings into new treatments, diagnostics, and improved healthcare practices that directly benefit human health.

#### **D. Event Overview**

- The conference was held in Hybrid mode (online mode and offline mode) and received a very good response from participants from different categories, such as diploma, undergraduate, postgraduate, research scholars and faculties from not only Pharmaceutical sciences, but also from fundamental sciences like Physics, Zoology and Sustainable energy and land Management. The conference hosted scientific oral and poster presentation competition in online and offline mode.
- Total registrations:
  - In the Online mode, 135 registrations were made across 11 states, including Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka, Goa, Uttarakhand, Tamil Nadu, Himachal Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Kerala, Andhra Pradesh and Rajasthan, thereby truly exhibiting the national character of the conference.
  - In the Offline mode, 262 registrations were done in different categories of participants, thereby receiving a massive response
- About 150 abstracts were received from the different categories of participants. The Online poster presentation was conducted on 24<sup>th</sup> April, 2025 that included 70 participants in presence of 4 evaluators, who were senior professors from academia.

## **E. Details of the Event:**

## II. Registrations

The conference was registered by more 262 candidates in offline mode (physical) and from 135 candidates in online mode, with a total of 397 candidates registering before the event. Few students also registered the event as spot registrations. The registrations received are enclosed as. Out of these candidates, there were 53 participants who presented their poster in the online mode and 27 candidates who attended the online conference by Google meet. From the 262 registrations, 237 candidates attended the event, of which 106 presented the scientific posters.

#### IV. Scientific Sessions

The conference was graced with two scientific sessions from renowned resource person in the pharma domain. The first session was delivered by Dr. Harsha Hegde, Scientist – F, ICMR-Belgavi on the topic ‘Reverse Pharmacology: A route to develop novel therapeutics from traditional medicinal practices’. The session was chaired by Dr. R. D. Hiremath, Principal, KDCA’s College of Pharmacy, Kolhapur, who also introduced the guest. Dr. Hegde stressed that reverse pharmacology was not just a scientific method, but a respectful integration of tradition and technology, thereby opening up exciting possibilities for discovering safe, effective, and affordable medicines rooted in time-tested practices.

The second scientific session was delivered by the industry expert and senior consultant Dr. Ravindra Purohit, Director RN Pharma Consulting, Pune. The session was chaired by Dr. Dhanraj Judge, Principal, Women’s College of Pharmacy, Peth Vadgaon. Dr. Purohit delivered his talk on the topic ‘From Lab to Life: Role of Academia, wherein he highlighted that in order to truly bring lab discoveries to life, we need to focus on entrepreneurship, innovation ecosystems, and real-world impact — not just publications. #### V. Scientific Oral and Poster Presentation sessions

After the sessions by the resource persons, followed by lunch, parallel scientific oral and poster presentations were conducted in the institute premises from 2 pm to 4.30 pm at Diploma Lecture Hall. Eleven selected abstracts were shortlisted for the invited oral presentations of 10 minutes each from the participants from the postgraduate, research scholars and faculty. The sessions were evaluated by two senior professors Dr. Mukesh Ratnaparkhi, Associate Professor, Marathwada Mitra Mandal’s College of Pharmacy, Pune and Dr. Amolkumar Kempwade, Professor, Dept. of Pharmaceutics, KLE College of Pharmacy, Nipani.

In the poster presentation session, the posters were segregated according to the category of students, including the Diploma / UG category which consisted 38 participants and the PG / PhD / Faculty category that consisted 38 participants. The poster presentation sessions for the two categories were arranged separately at the Seminar Hall – 2 (2<sup>nd</sup> floor). The evaluation of the posters was done by 4 senior professors, including Dr. Suhas Awati, Professor, Dept. of Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Dr. Shivajirao Kadam College of Pharmacy, Kasbe Digraj, Dr. S. R. Patil, Professor, Dept. of Pharmaceutics, Sarojini College of Pharmacy, Kolhapur, Dr. Sandip Bandgar, Professor, Dept. of Pharmaceutics, AMCP – Peth Vadgaon., and Dr. Sandip Honmane, Associate Professor and HOD – Dept. of Pharmaceutics, Annasaheb

Dange College of Pharmacy, Ashta.

Since the conference was held in hybrid mode, there were 136 online registrations. As a result, for proper conduction of the online poster presentation, the date of online poster presentation was scheduled 2 days before the date of conference, i.e. on 24<sup>th</sup> April 2025 using the online platform - Google meet. There were 53 participants in the online mode, where each participant was allotted 5 minutes of time to deliver his poster presentation and face questions from jury. Patil, Professor, Dept. of Pharmaceutics, Sarojini College of Pharmacy, Kolhapur, and Dr. Mohan Dhere, Associate Professor, Dept. of Pharmaceutics, Sarojini College of Pharmacy, Kolhapur.

#### VI. Prize Distribution and Valedictory function

Patil, M.D. (Medicine), Principal, G.N.R.H Medical College, Solapur, Mr. Dilip Jadhav, Retired IAS & Project Advisor, Mumbai, Mr. Deepak Desai, Chief Consultant – Business Brains, Kolhapur and Hon. Mrs. Shobha Tawde, Secretary – R. L. Tawde Foundation, Kolhapur. The valedictory function was anchored by Mrs. N. S. Wani. The chief guest Dr. S. P. Patil was introduced by the faculty Ms. S. U. Kadam, Assistant Professor, SCOP, Kolhapur. After the felicitation of the guests, the jury members of the Oral and Poster presentation sessions and the sponsors of the conference were also felicitated. The reading of the Conference Proceedings was done by Dr. A. U. Arvindekar (Org. Secy., ETDDTR-2025), followed by the feedback by few delegates. This was followed by the words of wisdom of the chief guest.

A similar pattern of prizes was followed for the prizes in online mode. The proceedings was released during the Inaugural function of the event by the dignitaries, which contained 7 full papers and 140 abstracts after peer-review.

### **H. YouTube Live Streaming of ETDDTR-2025**

Another highlight of this conference was that the entire conference was broadcasted live for the entire day using the social media platform YouTube, so that the candidates registered for the conference using online mode, as well as the scientific community at large can gain an access to the conference. ### **I. Event Documentation**

To capture the essence and impact of the program, comprehensive photographic documentation was carried out at various stages, including the inaugural ceremony, scientific sessions, certificate distribution, student feedback sessions, and the closing ceremony. This served as valuable evidence of the program's success and effectiveness.

### **J. Feedback Analysis**

A detailed Feedback Analysis was conducted using Google Forms, wherein the participants in both online and offline mode provided their responses and overall feedback for the conference based on the questionnaire provided. Two separate feedback forms were made available for Online and Offline candidates, respectively. 119 candidates in the online mode and 161 candidates in the offline mode recorded their responses. In the Feedback analysis of the Offline mode, the conference received a highly positive feedback, with about 80% of participants rating it as Good or Excellent, reflecting a satisfaction with the program's content, delivery, and effectiveness. Further, 90% of the candidates were interested to attend or recommend this conference again in future. Feedback analysis of the Online mode showed

even better results than that of the Offline mode, with about 95% of participants rated Good or Excellent. Only 1-2% rated it as Poor to Average, indicating that the program successfully met participants' expectations. Moreover, 97% of the participants attended the live streaming of the conference, and 100% of the participants responded that they would like to attend or recommend such conference in future. The detailed feedback analysis with questions is attached in the annexure.

#### **K. Problems Encountered:**

Despite the success of the program, certain challenges were encountered like the constraints in time management. The event few issues of unforeseen delays in proper time management due to extended length of talk by the resource persons or an extended time required due to the Question/Answer session or panel discussions, which could not be avoided, and delayed the program by almost an hour

#### **L. Summary**

ETDDTR-2025 conference was aimed to bring together esteemed scholars, industry experts, policymakers, and professionals to discuss and exchange knowledge on the emerging tools and techniques in the field of pharmaceutical research.

The conference was held in Hybrid mode and received a very good response from participants from different categories as diploma, undergraduate, postgraduate, research scholars, faculties from Pharma and allied fields. The conference hosted scientific oral and poster presentation competition both in online and offline mode. In the online mode, 135 registrations were done across 11 states, while in the offline mode, 262 registrations were done, thereby receiving a massive response, and truly exhibiting its national character. About 150 abstracts were received from the different categories of participants. The Online poster presentation was conducted on 24<sup>th</sup> April, 2025 for about 53 participants in presence of 4 evaluators as senior professors from academia.

The chief patrons for this event were Prof. D.T. Shirke, Vice Chancellor, Shivaji University, Kolhapur and Prof. Dr. P. S. Patil, Pro-Vice Chancellor, Shivaji University, Kolhapur.

The conference was be graced by the keynote address of Prof. Dr. M. S. Ganachari, Registrar KLE Academy of Higher Education & Research, Belgavi. Among the two scientific sessions conducted by eminent resource persons, the first session was conducted by Dr. Harsha Hegde, Scientist – F, ICMR, Belgavi and Dr. Ravindra Purohit, Director R. N. Pharma Consulting, Pune. Following lunch, parallel sessions of Oral and Poster presentation were conducted at the institute premises. About 11 invited oral

presentations were conducted and 106 posters were displayed for evaluation by 6 evaluators of senior professor grade.

The abstracts and full papers received from the participants was subjected to peer review and be published as a special issue of Conference Proceedings in form of an ISBN book. Further, a live Youtube streaming was done for the entire conference event on 26<sup>th</sup> April, so that the online participants and the scientific community at large across the world could gain an access to this event. The event received a positive feedback in online and offline mode, as shown by the feedback analysis.

## M. . Conclusion

The success of the conference “Emerging Trends in Drug Discovery & Translational Research – 2025” underscores the importance of need of upgrading the knowledge and latest trends of the pharmaceutical industry in shaping career-ready professionals. The scientific sessions by the resource persons not only enhanced students’ technical skills and inform them the current needs of the industry expected from the students, but also highlighted the technologies and strategies that bridged the gap between lab discoveries and clinical applications. 
